Match the conditions with the correct description by putting the letters next to the matching conditions.

Letter	Conditions	Definitions
	Autism	A - An episode of acute intense anxiety, with symptoms such as pounding or racing heart, sweating, trembling or shaking, feelings of choking or smothering, chest pain, nausea, dizziness, feelings of unreality, and chills or hot flashes.
	Substance abuse	B - Uncontrolled ingestion of large quantities of food in a given amount of time, often with a sense of lack of control over the activity. It is sometimes followed by purging.
	Panic attacks	C - Maladaptive pattern of use of a drug, alcohol, or other chemical agent that may lead to social, occupational, psychological, or physical problems.
	Phobias	D - Caused by exposure to an intensely traumatic event, such as rape or assault, military combat or bombing of civilians, torture, death camps, natural disasters, terrible accidents, developmentally inappropriate sexual experiences, or life-threatening illness
	Dissociative disorder	E - a symptom or feature of mental illness typically characterized by radical changes in personality, impaired functioning, and a distorted or non-existent sense of objective reality.
	Binge eating	F - Is an intense but unrealistic fear that can interfere with the ability to socialize, work, or go about everyday life, brought on by an object, event or situation.
	Body dysmorphic disorder (BDD)	G - Is a persistent, compulsive dependence on a behaviour or substance.
	Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD)	H - Is a complex developmental disorder distinguished by difficulties with social interaction, verbal and nonverbal communication, and behavioural problems, including repetitive behaviours and narrow focus of interest.
	Addictions	I - A preoccupation with one or more imagined defects in appearance.
	Psychosis	J - A category of <i>DSM-IV</i> disorder in which emotional conflicts are so repressed that a separation or split in the personality occurs, resulting in an altered state of consciousness or a confusion in identity.
